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SB1 boosts Caltrans maintenance program by more than \$7 billion; 1,000 improvement projects are in the pipeline

When most people hear the word "shop," they think of a weekly trip to the supermarket, or perhaps checking out an on-line sale at Amazon or a favorite department store. But in the world of asphalt pavements in California, the "SHOPP" is one of the most important terms in our world.

SHOPP is an acronym meaning State Highway Operations Protection Program," and is the key fund, and list of projects, that as its name suggests results in projects that repair or rehabilitate pavements and other state-owned transportation infrastructure.

Although rarely mentioned by name other than by policy wonks, the SHOPP was nevertheless the signature feature of last year's landmark passage of SB1, the 10-year, \$50 billion transportation investment measure. The bill's primary focus was "fix it first," or investing money to maintain the state's current transportation system, over building new facilities or capacity. The program focusing on new facilities is known as the STIP, or State Transportation Improvement Program.

Years of dwindling funds for maintenance resulted in the crumbling

roads and drumbeat of public complaints that reached a crescendo at this time last year when the Legislature passed, and Gov. Jerry Brown signed into law, SB1, authored by state Sen. Jim Beall, D-San Jose. The signature revenue compromise in the bill, a 12-cent per gallon increase in the state's fuel tax -- the first such hike

since 1994 -- kicked in in November.

The passage of SB1 means a big jump in paving work across California, resulting in a smoother

ride for motorists.

The resulting new revenue sent transportation planners back to the drawing board, dusting off dormant maintenance project and designing new ones, which should start to appear on bid lists this construction season.

Caltrans last week submitted a revised SHOPP to the Legislature last week, as required by law to do every two years, and it bore little resemblance to the bare-bones programs of recent years. The 2018 SHOPP includes 1,000 projects valued at \$18 billion over four years,



which is a whopping \$7 billion more than the 2016 SHOPP.

"In prior years, we had to postpone projects due to lack of funds but now we are accelerating those projects that are improving our roads, bridges, drainage systems and reducing congestion," said Caltrans Director Laurie Berman in announcing the new SHOPP. "We have a long list of projects and road work that needs to get done, and SB1 funds allow us to get it done benefiting communities across the state."

Indeed, the paltry 2016 SHOPP and STIP may have represented a

crossroads for all transportation stakeholders, according to new California Transportation Commission Chairwoman Fran Inman. In an exclusive interview for the current issue of CalAPA's "California Asphalt" magazine, she recalled how the commission came face-to-

face with a hard dose of reality in the form of skyrocketing maintenance costs and dwindling funds, forcing the commission to reduce its fund estimate.

"I do think that moment ... was a defining moment for a lot of folks," Inman said. You can read the full interview HERE.

The 2018 update of the STIP also gets a boost from SB1. It contains \$3.28 billion for projects over the next five years. Over \$2 billion of the STIP is newly available money, official say.




